Dear Chief Justice:

I am delighted with your proposed addition to No. 370, Home Building & Loan Association v. Blaisdell. It seems to me that it meets very effectively the chief point in Justice Sutherland's dissent and strengthens the prevailing opinion.

I enclose herewith the substance of the order amending my opinion in No. 11. I have referred to the opinion as the opinion "delivered", since the sentence which is ordered to be stricken out does not appear anywhere else.

I also enclose the form of decree in No. 2 Original, Vermont v. New Hampshire, which has now been approved by everyone. As this decree is intended to designate a Commissioner to fix the boundary, we will have to agree on the Commissioner before it can be put down. As you did not sit in the case I am reminding Justice VanDevanter that a Commissioner should be agreed upon.
