Dear Mr. Frost:

I talked with Peters over the telephone last night and he informed me they were in 21 feet on the $3\frac{1}{2}$ tunnel drift and had come into a wall with talc on it about 5/8 of an inch thick, which Peters thinks is the foot wall of the vein.

I talked with Eikelberger over the phone today about it and he said that width of talc is plenty as it is as much width as the Sunshine has on its face. He also told me to write you that the snow is going off rapidly and he would delay his report until he could get into the big vein. He thought the assays I sent him were very good indeed and stated he wanted to get some assays from the samples being taken by Peters on the big vein below. I told him Peters said of the samples taken thus far there were sulphides in them, and Eikelberger said if we got any values there **it** would increase the value of the property in his estimation wonderfully, although if we did not he would not be discouraged as he is still of the opinion that the depth on that vein would come into commercial ore.

Mr. Eikelberger tells me Richardson will be back the latter part of this week to meet with him and show him the upper tunnel and the places where the assays which I sent Mr. Eikelberger(copies of which I sent you yesterday) came from.
