My dear Mr. Justice:

Last night the Berkeley High School Auditorium was filled to capacity with 900 thoughtful men and women, of all ages, in a meeting of protest against the President's subtle movement against your august court.

May I pray that none of you gentlemen resign in the face of the Presidential attack? It may be said, fairly, that millions of people are with you.

The congress will quickly know that the country has acted, in large part, against authorizing the Chief Executive to embark in the packing business.

It is patent that: If one over 70 should not function in a judicial capacity, none should introduce measures, advocate or vote to pass into laws who has attained that age, young tho it is considered nowadays.

It is my impression that the junior Senator from California is committed to the sentiment that life begins at 70. It would ill become him to favor the President's intent as read into the text of his message to the Congress February 5th.

This letter does not invite an answer. It does from Hon. Wm. G. McAdoo, to whom I send a copy.
