7. R. Arnold Kramer, partner in Kramer, Dye, McNabb & Greenwood, Knoxville, Tennessee, who will give a talk on "Antitrust Problems of the Small Business Man";
8. Truman Hobbs, partner in Godbold, Hobbs & Copeland, Montgomery, Alabama, who will give a talk on "Product Liability Problems"; and
9. John Izard, Jr., partner in Spalding, Sibley, Troutman, Meadow & Smith, Atlanta, Georgia, who will give a talk on "Tax Problems Involved in Doing Business in Several States,"
