MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

Subject: The Dow-Jones Index

- 1. I have found out that <u>Manny Cohen of the SEC has for some time been in touch</u> <u>informally with the New York Stock Exchange about the Dow-Jones Index</u> <u>problem</u>. (This is the problem Richard Berlin wrote to Jack Valenti about).
- 2. The Exchange apparently agrees that the Dow-Jones Index ought to be revised or superseded. The Exchange has talked with the Dow-Jones people, and will continue to push them.
- 3. I would <u>recommend</u> that, for the present, <u>Cohen continue his informal approaches</u>, working with Funston and Frank of the Exchange. This is a rather <u>delicate</u> <u>problem</u>, and can probably best be handled on an informal basis.
- 4. I attach alternative <u>draft notes</u> that Jack might send to Berlin.
