Wynn - Haft family in Safeway takeover attempt \$150 million (lawyers and bankers - another \$150 million in fees)

Hatfield - Wickes Corp. in Owens Corning Fiberglas attempt \$30 million

Goldsmith in Goodyear attempt \$160 million

Stone - Goldsmith in Goodyear attempt \$94 million - selling shares back \$34 million - expenses paid by Goodyear
