

Upon consideration of the sealed <u>ex parte</u> affidavit of Assistant United States Attorney Charles Carberry and having reviewed the redacted and unredacted copies of the Boesky cooperation agreement, it is hereby found that the government has shown good cause for the redaction of the two categories of material from the agreement:

1) the first is material that if currently released could be a hinderance to ongoing criminal investigations because its public release could result in the possible tailoring of testimony; and

2) the second category is a list of entities whose public release currently would both hinder the investigation and possibly result in unfair speculation as to wrongdoing by both entities and individuals.
