There is another Advisory Committee called the Regulatory Advisory Committee which deals with a variety of different matters which I think it was envisioned that this Subcommittee might handle. A topic which was of interest when Ed Morris was in charge of arbitration, was the status of class action arbitrations. However, it seems that this issue is being solved by others. Further, Ed Morris is now the Exchange's Hearing Officer.

Traditionally, the Legal Advisory Committee has been more issuer oriented and other committees have dealt with broker dealer and litigation matters. As we have discussed, there are few litigators on the committee.
